

## Prof. Wu Jinglian Receives the China Economics Prize

On March 24, 2005, at the People's Great Hall in Beijing, CEIBS professor, Wu Jinglian, the Bao Steel Chair Professor of Economics and member of CEIBS Academic Council, received the highest award for economics in China, the China Economics Prize. The vice-premier and member of the CPC Central Political Bureau, Mr. Zeng Peiyan, attended the award ceremony and delivered a speech.

The China Economics Prize is jointly conferred by the China Macro-economics Institute under the State Development Planning Commission and the China Society of Economic Reform, which aims to recognize and reward individual economist's prominent and long-term achievements. In deciding the laureates, consideration was given to an economist's overall contribution to economic development rather than the achievements of a single research project.



## Prof. Liu Ji Speaks at the Boao Forum

Prof. Liu Ji, CEIBS Honorary President, addressed to the roundtable on "the Peaceful Rise of China and the New Role of Asia" during this year's Boao Forum for Asia held in April. Professor Liu elaborated on the four reasons for "the Peaceful Rise of China": 1) China is a large country with a population over 1.3 billion, which justifies its abundant resources and a huge market of internal needs; 2) With unbalanced developments in different parts of China, there is a huge potential in discovering and developing new natural resources; 3) China is undergoing a transformation from a planned economy to a market economy. This transformation is becoming a driving force for the country's sustainable development in the future; and 4) With China's further opening-up and its participation in the competition and cooperation in today's globalized economy, China is certain to enjoy the benefits from an "all-win" global economic growth, which will greatly propel the country's rise.



## Prof. Pedro Nueno Is Appointed Member of Visiting Committee of Harvard Business School
